
Volunteer Bart Invested with MBE



An Adult Volunteer has had their service in helping the Cadet Forces recognised by royalty. Captain Bart Lucas (76), from 1st Battalion The Highlanders Army Cadet Force, was invested with his MBE last Wednesday at the Palace of Holyrood House in Edinburgh by Her Royal Highness Princess Anne, The Princess Royal.

Bart, who is the Detachment Commander of Culloden Detachment, was recognised in the 2023 King's Birthday Honours for his services to the cadets and Young People of the Highlands.

Bart has been a volunteer with the Army Cadets since December 1976, as well as prior Military Service in the Royal Air Force and service within the old Northern Constabulary – now Police Scotland. Throughout his forty-seven years of volunteering with the cadets he has held almost every post you can think of, from Detachment Commander and Company Commander to Adventure Training Officer and Duke of Edinburgh Award Officer, some posts he's held several times over his long career.





Donations were welcomed from parents, family members and members of the community as they were treated to a thought-provoking and at times emotional performance from the Primary 6/7 and Primary 7 children. The tea and coffee was flowing well and many delicious cakes were enjoyed.







We believe that the best way to support our communities is to listen and develop an understanding of your needs and concerns and then, where possible, facilitate a programme that meets these.

FORCES CHILDREN – Additional Learning Needs

The Centre for Military Research, Education & Public Engagement, Edinburgh Napier University, are working in partnership with ADES and the National Education Officer for children and young people of armed forces families, on a two-year research project, funded by the Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust. The project is to develop a clear pathway to benefit serving and veteran parents and their children with additional support needs, when transitioning to and from Scotland. Work will be based on the identification of enablers and barriers impacting the child's learning journey, wellbeing, and family life. This will empower policymakers with evidence-based recommendations to catalyse whole-system change.
